Launch of MRI facility

August 20 marked a major milestone for the Global Hospital & Research Centre trust. The Dadi Prakashmani MRI Centre at the Radha Mohan Mehrotra Global Hospital Trauma Centre was thrown open for the service of the community. This is district Sirohi's first (and only) MRI facility. Indian Oil (Aarogyam), THDC Limited (SEWA THDC), Point of Life Inc. (USA) and the Brahma Kumaris worldwide centres majorly contributed towards the cost of the Siemens Magnetom Altea 1.5T MRI machine. With a tag of Rs 9.4 crore, the MRI is the most expensive equipment the trust has ever purchased. The contributions from Indian Oil Limited and THDC Limited are the highest Corporate Social Responsibility donations ever received.

Blood donation drives

The Rotary International Global Hospital Blood Bank collected 860 units internally and 1188 units at nine blood donation programmes, from 2048 donors. Against this, 1034 patients were served. One in five of the 2128 blood and blood components units issued was given for free. The Thalassemia Day Care Centre attached to the blood bank consumed 11% units, the Radha Mohan Mehrotra Global Hospital Trauma Centre consumed 8% and the remaining units were consumed externally.
