BLOOD BANKING UPDATE

The Rotary International Global Hospital Blood Bank collected 1,658 units of blood over the quarter, 47% from donation programmes and the rest from walk-ins.

A mega donation programme in the Brahma Kumaris campus in Abu Road yielded 437 units of blood. A donation programme patronised by the workers of the North Western Railway Employees Union yielded 162 units, one conducted with the Lions Club, Pindwada, and Trinity Education Society, Pindwada, yielded 72 units, one

conducted at Madhav University, Abu Road, yielded 59 units, and one with the Central Reserve Police Force, Internal Security Academy, Mt Abu, yielded 44 units.

The blood was processed into 3,441 units of whole blood, packed cells, fresh frozen plasma, platelets and cryoprecipitate.

3,632 units were issued to 796 patients, 13% for free. Only 28% of the units were used in-house.



A trauma patient's journey to wellness

Raj Parihar, a 20-year-old native of Abu Road, suffered grievous perforation of his intestines in a road traffic accident on December 24, 2025. His relatives rushed him first to a local hospital and then to another hospital in the neighbouring town of Palanpur. Despite undergoing multiple operations to repair his intestine, Raj's condition worsened. On January 8, 2026, he was brought to the Radha Mohan Mehrotra Global Hospital Trauma Centre, with a severely leaking intestine needing urgent repair. Dr Anil Bhansali performed a controlled fistula via laparotomy on Raj to restore gastrointestinal continuity, after which he went on to make a gradual but successful recovery.

A Siemens-sponsored community initiative

Access to Primary Healthcare, an 18-month initiative to deliver primary healthcare services through a mobile clinic to around 50,000 socio-economically deprived people in 38 villages in Sirohi, an aspirational district, served 6,355 people, 53% were women and girls. About 77% patients were from below poverty line backgrounds. Further, 28% patients were aged less than five, 17% were aged 6 to 15, 47% were aged 16 to 60 and 7% were aged more than 60.

Siemens Healthineers sponsored this project to increase access to essential health consultation services by those at the bottom-of-the-pyramid.

Eight community awareness and screening events attracted 1,176 patients for cancer (breast cancer, cervical cancer, oral cancer) and non-communicable disease screening.

Three puppet shows performed by experts in the local dialect helped enthuse villagers about health-related issues.

This successful project came to a close in this quarter.
